

Soapbox Science was founded in 2011 in London by scientists Nathalie Pettorelli and Seirian Sumner, inspired by Speakers' Corner in London's Hyde Park. There, during victorian times, men and women spoke up about civil rights, often by standing on a wooden crate originally used for the shipment of soap. Speakers' Corner was thus born out of struggle for civil liberties and was significant milestone in the development of british democratic institutions.
